Practitioner seeks to register with ACC

If you want to provide rongoā Māori services to ACC kiritaki (clients), you will first need to register with us as a rongoā Māori vendor.

Practitioner completes registration forms

You'll need to complete and return the following forms (with any required attachments) to our Registration team at:

registrations@acc.co.nz.

- ACC111: our standard vendor registration form.
- ACC7425: this form asks about you, your experience and endorsements to validate your mātauranga in rongoā Māori. It also asks for your consent to share your clinic contact details online.

ACC assesses registration forms

The ACC7425 is reviewed by our Māori Health Partnerships team who will make contact with you and your mentors, if required. The team generally allows 20 working days for this process to be completed.

If all the required information or endorsements are not provided within that timeframe, your application will be put on hold and we'll email you to let you know.


Police Vetting process

Once we have reviewed your forms, we will send you a New Zealand Police Vetting form to complete. (A guide is available on the Police website.)

You will receive your results from New Zealand Police and we will be notified of the outcome.

Our team will contact you to discuss any results flagged during the Police Vetting process.
